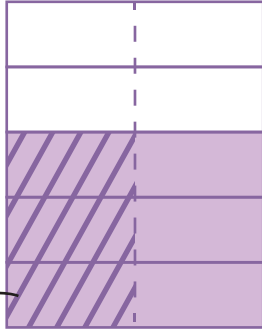




Dividing Fractions

$$\frac{3}{5} \div 2 =$$

$$\frac{1}{10}$$



3 out of (5×2) parts of a whole.

$$\frac{3}{5} \div 2 = \frac{3}{5 \times 2} = \frac{3}{10}$$
